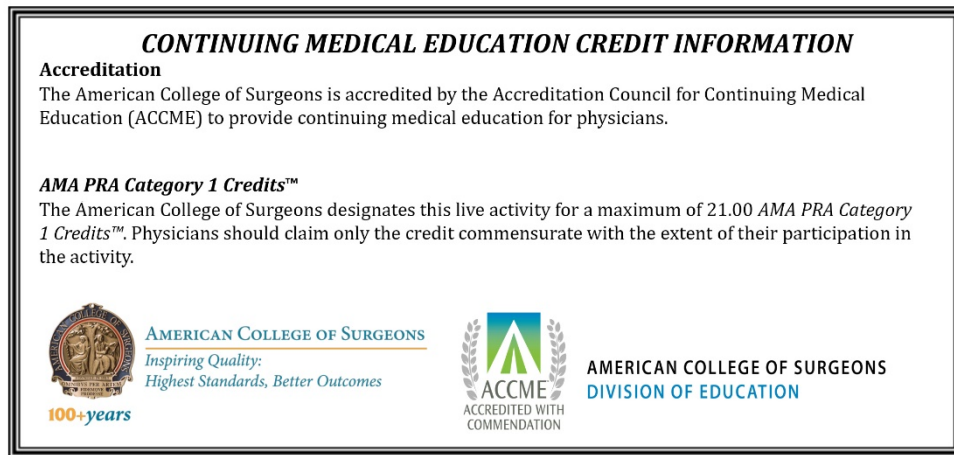

Course Objectives

This meeting will address relevant issues in trauma, emergency general surgery, and acute care as we move toward the new normal. 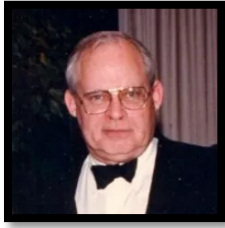

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

CHARLES C. WOLFERTH, JR., MD, MEMORIAL LECTURE



CHARLES C. WOLFERTH, JR., MD, a nationally known surgeon and medical expert, spearheaded a state law that created the Pennsylvania Trauma System Foundation. He battled for decades to develop a foundation that would monitor the quality of care in hospital trauma centers. His goal was to help prevent victims from dying needlessly during that “golden hour” – the first 60 minutes of care that can make the difference between life and death. Ultimately, the foundation became a model for other states. “Dr. Wolferth created a model that no other state can match,” said Dr. C. William Schwab, Founding Chief of Trauma and Critical Care Surgery at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

Known as the “surgeon’s surgeon,” Schwab said, “there was no one better.” Dr. Wolferth was head of the Department of Surgery at Graduate Hospital when he retired in 1998. During his 44-year career, he was Department Head, surgeon and teacher at HUP, Hahnemann University and Presbyterian Hospitals, and other medical centers. He was a member of 56 medical societies and the recipient of numerous awards, including the prestigious National Safety Council Surgeons Award for Services to Safety in 2000. Dr. Wolferth was the chief architect of the Point/Counterpoint Conference.

Edward E. Cornwell, III, MD, FACS, FCCM, FWACS, will be the 2021 Charles C. Wolferth, Jr., MD, Memorial Lecturer.

EDWARD E. CORNWELL, III, MD, FACS, FCCM, FWACS

Dr. Cornwell is the LaSalle D. Leffall Jr. Professor and former Chair, Department of Surgery, Howard University College of Medicine. He was born in Washington, D.C. and graduated from Sidwell Friends High School, and earned his undergraduate degree at Brown University. He graduated from the Howard University College of Medicine as President of the class of 1982 and is a member of Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society.

He received his surgical training (internship and residency) at the Los Angeles County +University of Southern California Medical Center (1982-1987) and his trauma/critical care fellowship at the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems in Baltimore, Maryland (1987-1989). He has been certified and re-certified in both General Surgery and Surgical Critical Care by the American Board of Surgery.

He has risen through the academic ranks through teaching and clinical appointments at Howard University (1989-1993), the University of Southern California (1993-1997), Johns Hopkins School of Medicine (1998- to 2008), and presently at Howard University (Professor and Chair 2008–2021 and Interim Dean 2014-2015).

Dr. Cornwell’s career interest is in the prevention, treatment, and outcome disparities of traumatic injuries, and their critical care sequelae. He has authored or co-authored over 325 articles and chapters and has given over 400 invited presentations in the field. He has delivered the named lecture or keynote address at over 40 institutions and conferences. He is a reviewer for several surgical journals and is former deputy editor of JAMA-Surgery (formerly Archives of Surgery). He has served as President, Society of Black Academic Surgeons; President, Surgical Section of the National Medical Association, and Chairman of Trauma Net of Maryland. He is former Secretary of the American College of Surgeons and was on the Board of Managers of the American Association for Surgery of Trauma.

Dr. Cornwell has received numerous awards and citations for his efforts in education, outreach, and violence prevention. He has received major teaching awards in every faculty position he has held, and was selected as the commencement speaker at the USC School of Medicine in 1996, and at the HUCM in 2002. He received the Distinguished Alumni Award from HUCM in 2014, and a career award from the Surgical Section of the NMA in 2020.



SHARON M. HENRY AND MARYLAND COMMITTEE ON TRAUMA STATE-OF-THE-ART LECTURE

SHARON M. HENRY, MD, FACS, is the Anne Scalea Professor in Trauma at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and the Chief of the Division of Wound Healing and Metabolism at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center, where she is also the Head of the Soft Tissue Infection Service. In addition to being recognized as an international expert in trauma surgery and soft tissue infections, Dr. Henry is also widely known for her untiring commitment to the educational efforts of the American College of Surgeons' Committee on Trauma.

Upon becoming the State Chair of the Maryland COT in 2004, Dr. Henry set in motion the development of an impressive number of educational initiatives, which culminated into a very successful Annual Maryland COT Trauma Care Symposium, which she spearheaded for several years. Under her outstanding leadership, Maryland's ATLS program became one the best in the country. While personally engaged in teaching TEAM (Trauma Evaluation and Management) to thousands of medical students, she also brought ATOM, ASSET, RTTDC, DMEP and other advanced trauma courses to the Maryland COT, making all of them regularly available at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center.

In recognition for her tireless efforts at optimizing the care of the trauma patient, Dr. Henry has already received three Governor's Proclamations, two Shock Trauma Hero Awards, the Shock Trauma Superstar Award, the Department of Surgery Teaching Award and the Meritorious Service Award of the American College of Surgeons. In 2015, she was further acknowledged by the Maryland COT with the establishment of the Annual Sharon M. Henry, State of the Art Lecture.

Robert R. Redfield, III, MD, FACS, will be the 2021 Sharon M. Henry, MD, FACS, and Maryland Committee on Trauma State of the Art Lecturer.

ROBERT R. REDFIELD, III, MD, FACS

Dr. Redfield, former CDC Director, is currently serving Maryland as senior adviser for public health to support the state's public health response to COVID-19, including the emergence of new variants; the statewide vaccination campaign; and Maryland's science-based plan for fully and safely reopening the state.
